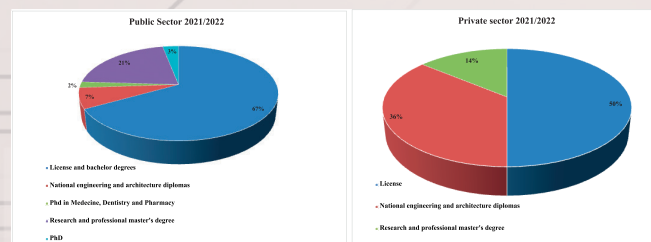

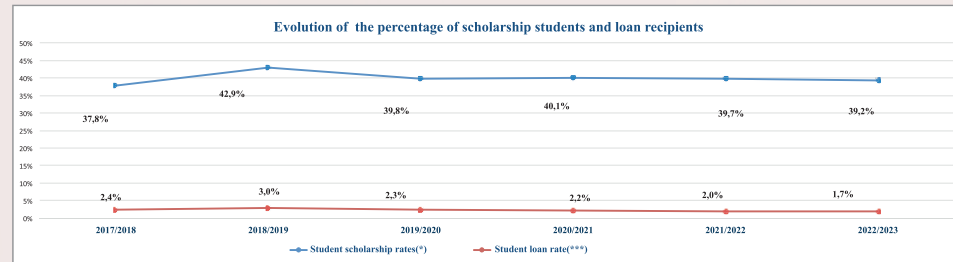

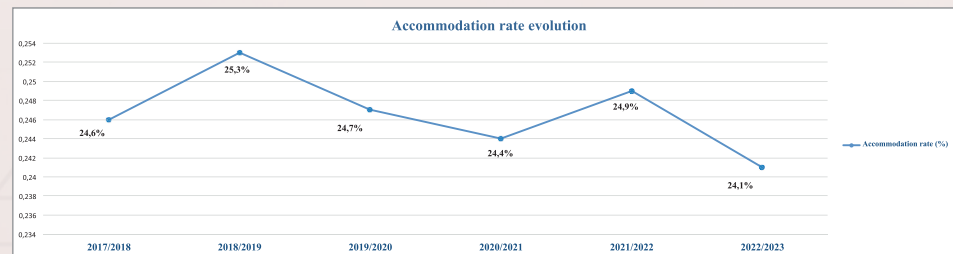

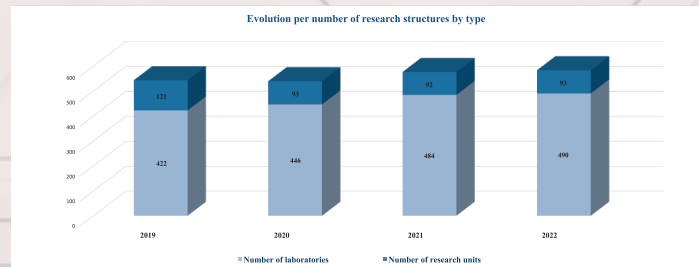

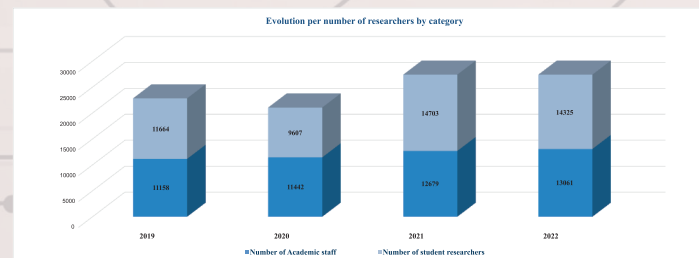

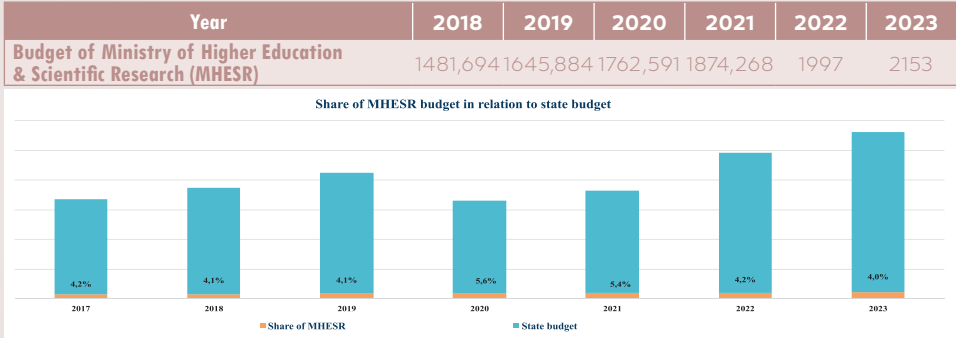

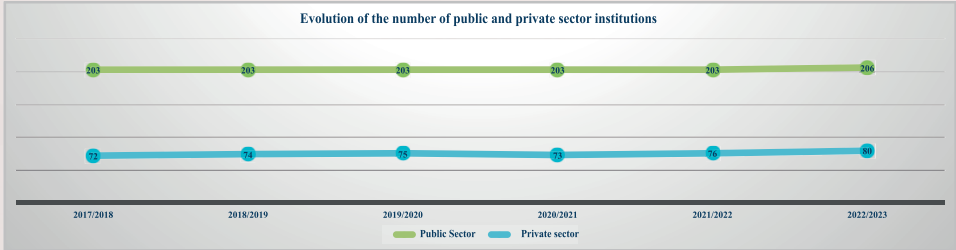

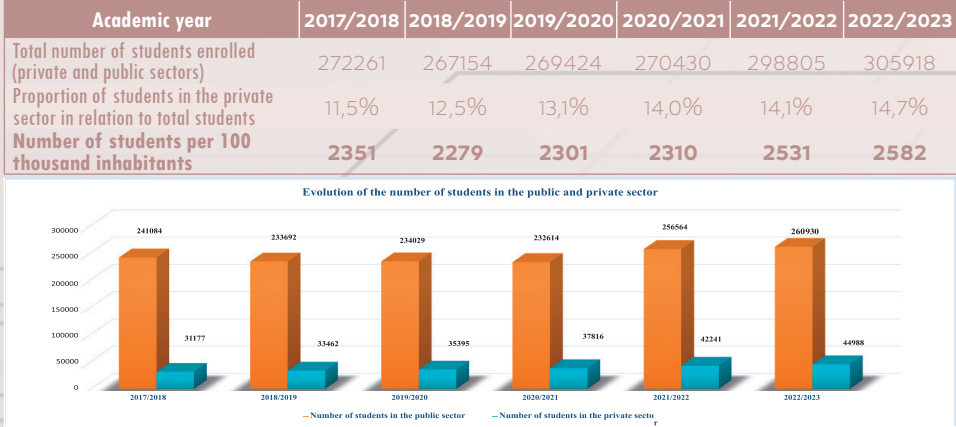

1. Evolutions of the number of institutions in the public and private sectors :

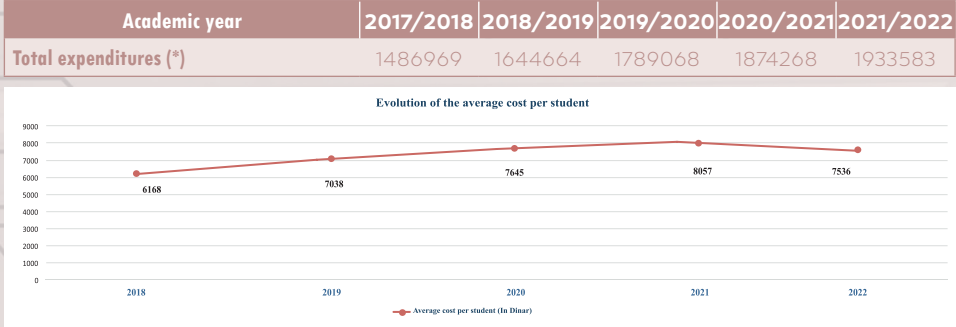


2. Evolutions of the number of students in the public and private sectors :



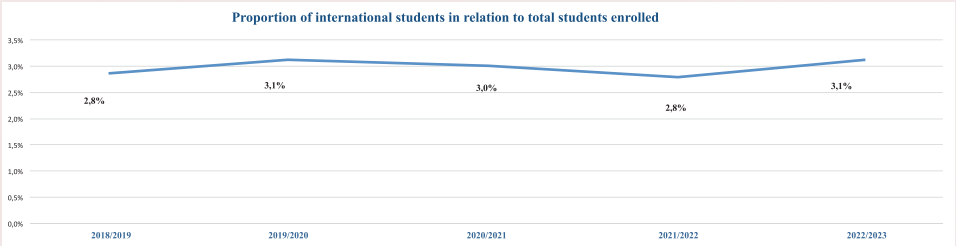
3. Evolution of the annual average cost per student in the public sector (at current prices) :

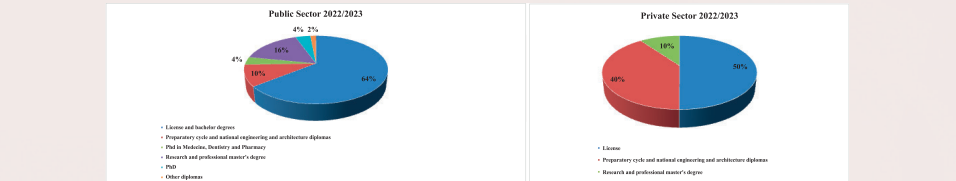

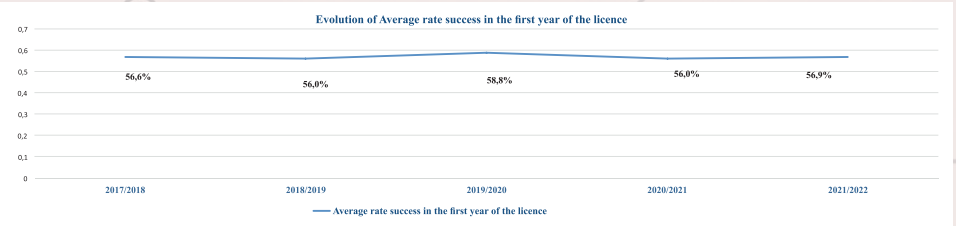
